### Early Years in PEI

- The Preschool Excellence Initiative aimed to provide equity from the start with supports to young children from birth to age four, their parents and their educators.
- To build an accessible, sustainable and qualitydriven system
  - Establish Early Years Centres
  - Renovate and equip available school space
  - Align Early Years Centres with family resources

#### Five Years Later


- Significant progress in PEI
- ECE Report 2014 found PEI tied with Quebec, ahead of other provinces
- Rapid transition to Early Years Centres
- Infrastructure for access and quality
- But, access now stalled and literacy challenges continue in schools








# The Effects of Weaknesses in Oral Language on Reading Growth (Hirsch, 1996)

### What the research says....

 Direct participation in early childhood education is the policy lever that impacts child outcomes and has economic benefits.

 A parenting focus can amplify benefits IF it models positive interactions and provides opportunities for practice

 Multi-year partnership that builds on CHANCES leadership and accomplishments

 Government's recent contributions include extension of Best Start from 2 to 3 years and funding for early literacy focus

A laboratory to test the full PEI vision

- Increasing family utilization across CHANCES program areas
- Professional Learning Agenda
