ACCOUNTABILITY

- 0.5 ECE under common department/ministry
- At least 3/3 of child care funding goes to program operations
- Full day kindergarten offered
- ECE curriculum framework
- Annual progress reports (2014 or later)

- 0.5 Common ECE supervisory unit
- Mandated salary and fee scale in licensed child care
- 50% of 2 to 4 year olds regularly attend an ECE program
- Alignment of ECE programs with kindergarten
- Standards for ECE programs include kindergarten

- Common ECE policy framework
- At least 3% of overall budget devoted to ECE
- Funding conditional on including children with special needs in licensed child care
- At least 3/3 of staff in programs for 2 to 4 years olds are qualified
- Population measures for preschool collected and reported

Common local authority for ECE administration and delivery

- Kindergarten educators require ECE qualifications
- Salaries of ECEs are at least 3/3 of teachers
- ECE professional certification/ professional development required








How to address rising income inequality

- Redistribute more income through higher taxes on wealthy.
- Problem is greater taxation on the top 1% or 10% won't solve the problem. They are simply too few in number.
- So, need higher taxes on middle income individuals. Less politically appealing and they have had weak income growth
- A more impactful approach is to <u>remove barriers to</u> <u>opportunity.</u>
- Help improve labour outcomes for low and middle income workers
- ECE can do this. It can help raise future income prospects of disadvantaged kids and can lift labour participation of women

Labour force participation of mothers: Quebec compared to OECD countries



Summary

- Additional investment in ECE will boost maternal labour force participation.
- Providing access to at least more than one year of ECE can improve math scores.
- Cost benefit analysis aligns with other research: ECE is a good investment, with many gains, including reducing inequality.
- Indeed, boosting female labour market participation lowers the Gini coefficient for families with young children and lifts many families out of poverty.
- Additional investments in ECE are recommended.




